Marking Threshold

This is the percentage threshold that will allow your students to retake their questions. For example, if you had a value of 0.5 (50%), any students who have a predicted percentage of less than 50% correct marks in this question will have to retake it.

Create School Class

If you have more than one class studying different subjects (e.g. a Combined Science class studying Biology, Chemistry & Physics), it's faster to add one class as described and then use the 'duplicate class' functionality
